

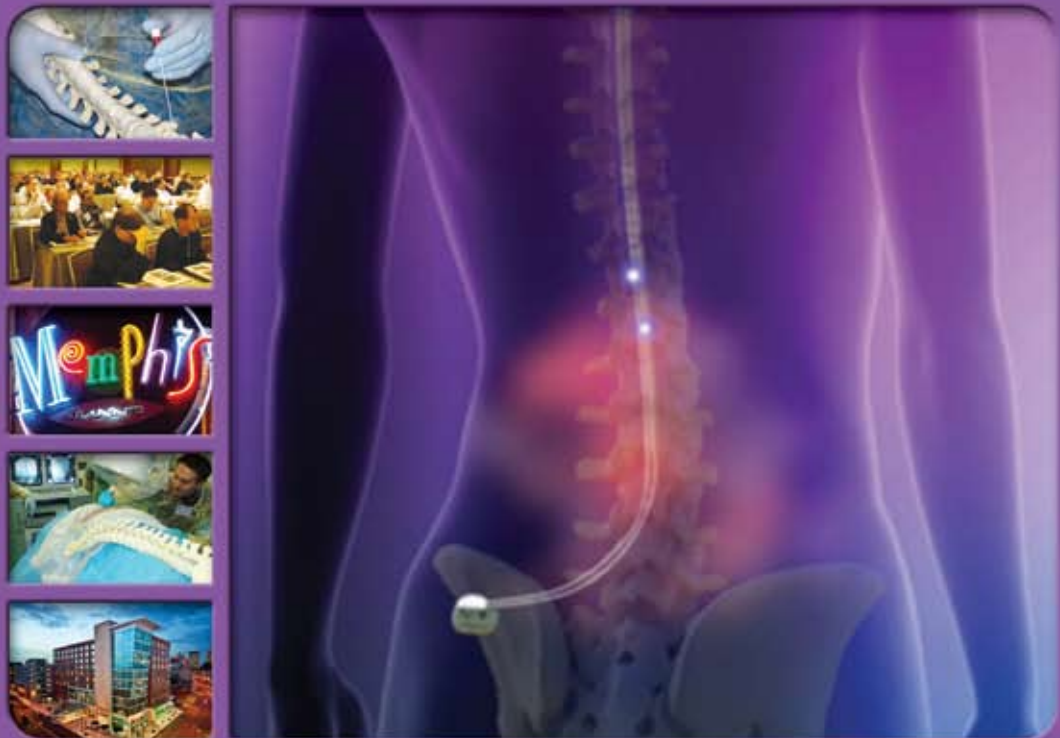

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Spinal Cord Stimulation And Intrathecal Implantable Infusion Systems Review Course & Cadaver Workshop

INTERMEDIATE AND ADVANCED

Description

This 2½-day comprehensive review course and hands-on cadaver workshop will describe and demonstrate improved skill levels of spinal cord stimulation and intrathecal implantable infusion systems. The desired outcome is for physicians to integrate various aspects of the interventional pain management techniques of spinal cord stimulation and intrathecal implantable infusion systems in treating patients in order to provide better outcomes and reduced side effects for patients.

The 1-day cadaver workshop includes hands-on workshop of interventional techniques in spinal cord stimulation and intrathecal implantable infusion systems through the utilization of cadavers.
